# CAPITAL PROJECTS

- 2024 MMCC Modernization NOHFC Grant
  - o Awaiting electrical transformer for outdoor sign
  - Final claim and reporting completed and under review
- 2024 MMCC HVAC NOHFC Grant
  - Completed final claim and report project is now fully complete
- Olympia Batteries (2025)
  - Staff continue to work with the supplier to negotiate pro-rating on batteries and testing to replace cells at the end of the 2024-25 ice season
  - $\circ~$  Scheduling and cost sharing discussions between supplier, Wawa and Marathon began

#### **Recreation report: January**

- January kicked off with a Wawa Minor Hockey Association (WMHA) camp from Jan 02-Jan 04, great attendance with the kids off school.
- WMHA also had numerous league games throughout January with towns such as Hearst, Chapleau, Smooth Rock Falls and Timmins coming to play. MMCC has received wide compliments on our space here from visitors.
- Mustangs had their bottle drive as well as hosted SSM for two games. On January 18<sup>th</sup> there was a two-person curling bonspiel that was well attended, and they had a lot of fun.
- Our new winter session of fitness classes has started, and we are welcoming two new instructors, Winter Dubbin and Mason Stencil. They are providing new classes such as strength training and band exercises. We are also trying something new by having a personal trainer in the gym twice a week to show our gym clients how to use the new equipment and help with any questions.

### TOURISM

#### Tourism report: January

Using a combination of our own social media as well as leveraging the online and social media presence of our partners at Algoma Kinniwabi Tourism Association (AKTA), DNO, and DO. This led to an increase in ticket sales for the 1<sup>st</sup> week in February.

Additional meetings are scheduled for staff training in February, and community outreach is planned for March before the April implementation of the program
